

HEERF II & III Student Aid Public Quarterly Report

Quarterly Report February 18, 2021 to March 31, 2021

South Puget Sound Community College acknowledges it signed and returned to the U.S. Department of Education the Certification and Agreement and gives the assurance that SPSCC has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

1. The total amount of funds SPSCC will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs is **\$1,499,870 CRRSAA and \$5,134,037 ARP**.
2. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs as of the date of this submission is **\$254,460**.
3. The estimated total number of students at SPSCC eligible to received Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Student under the CRRSA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs is **5,047**.
4. The total number of students who received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under the CRRSA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) is **433**.
5. The methods used to determine which student receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) are list below.

All students receiving grants must meet these criteria:

- Students must be enrolled during eligible quarters. Disbursements made under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) began after February 17, 2021.
- Maximum total award per student cannot exceed maximum Pell amount.
- Submit CARES Student Funding Needs application which includes statement of the students COVID impact.

Additional criteria used for the grant—

Applications submitted Winter Quarter 2021:

- Students were awarded a \$500 Emergency Financial Aid Grant for needs including food, books, tuition, housing, and other.

- Students were awarded an additional \$500 Emergency Financial Aid Grant to use towards technology if they had not previously received a technology award.
- Students were able to submit an application once during the term.

Instructions, directions and guidance are provided to grant applicants via email and text each quarter, in addition to being published on the South Puget Sound Community College website. In addition, outreach targeted to Pell Eligible students who have not applied is done at mid-quarter.
