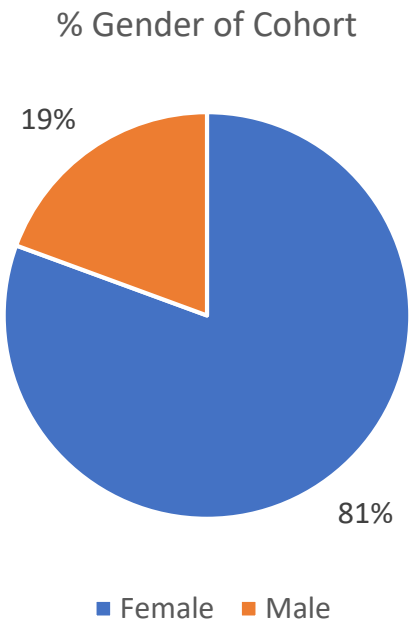

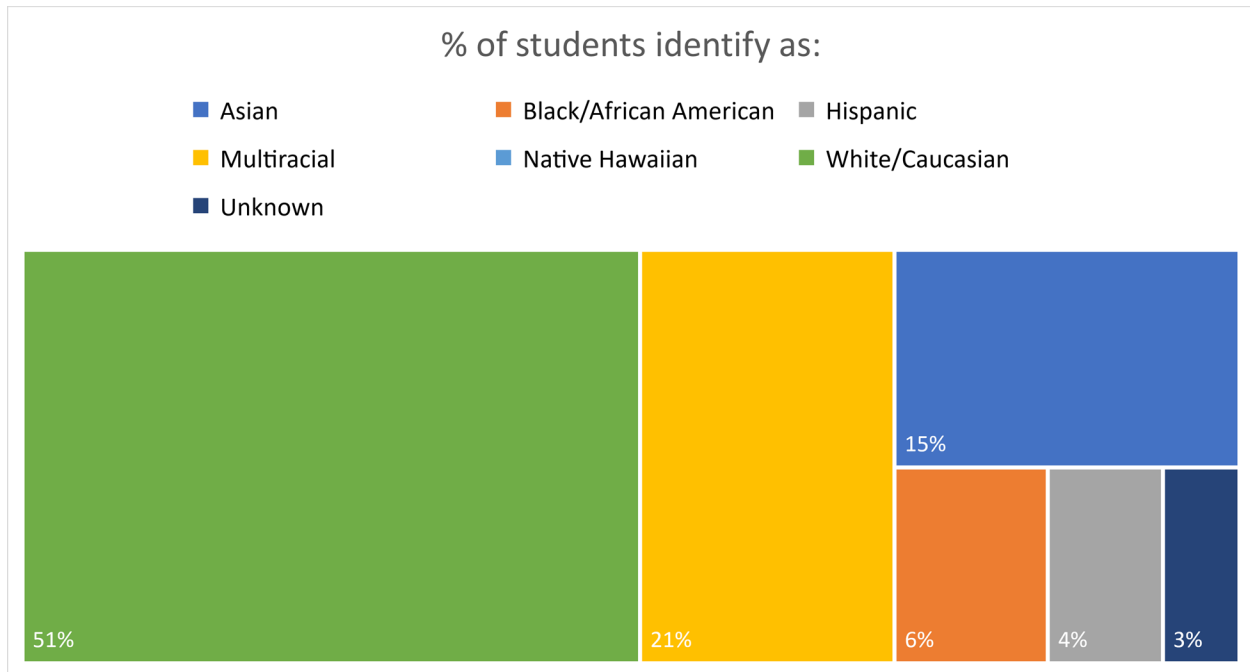

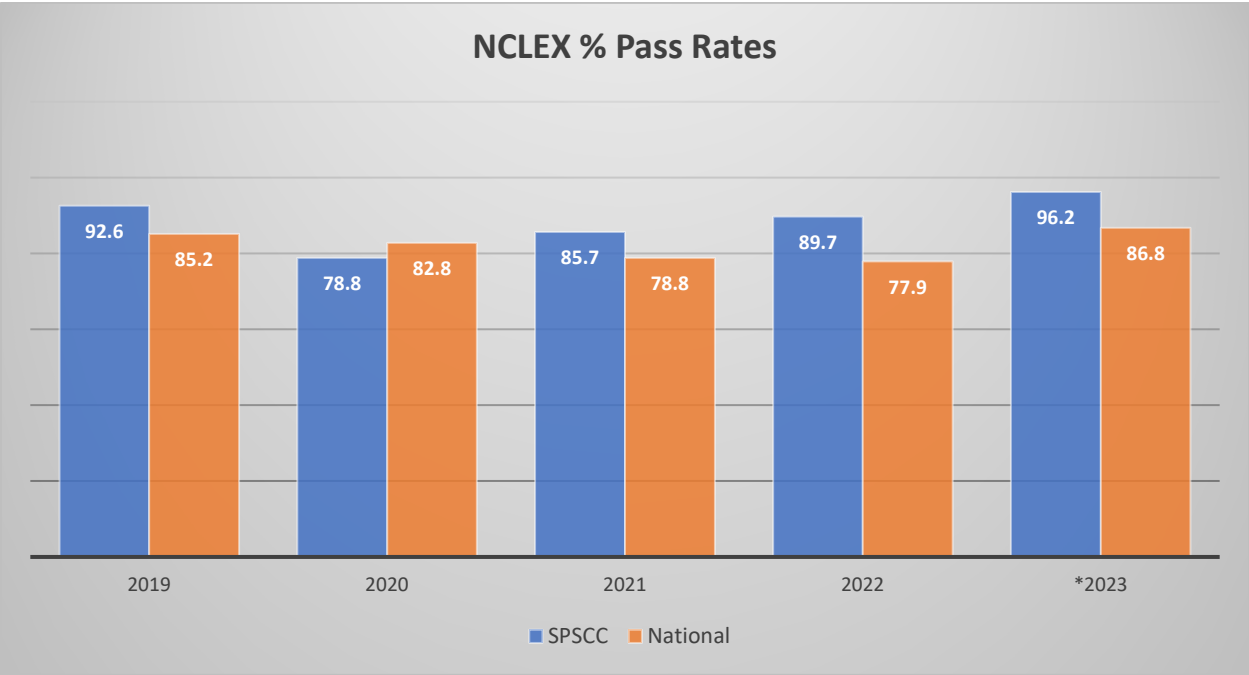

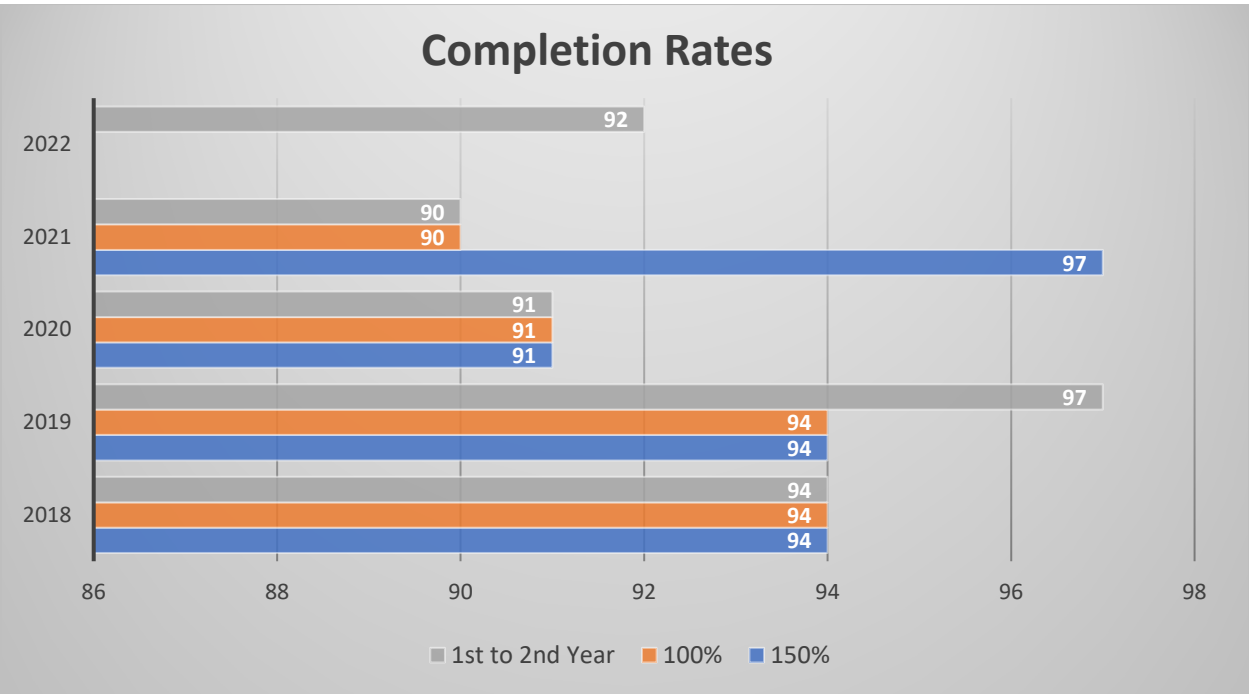

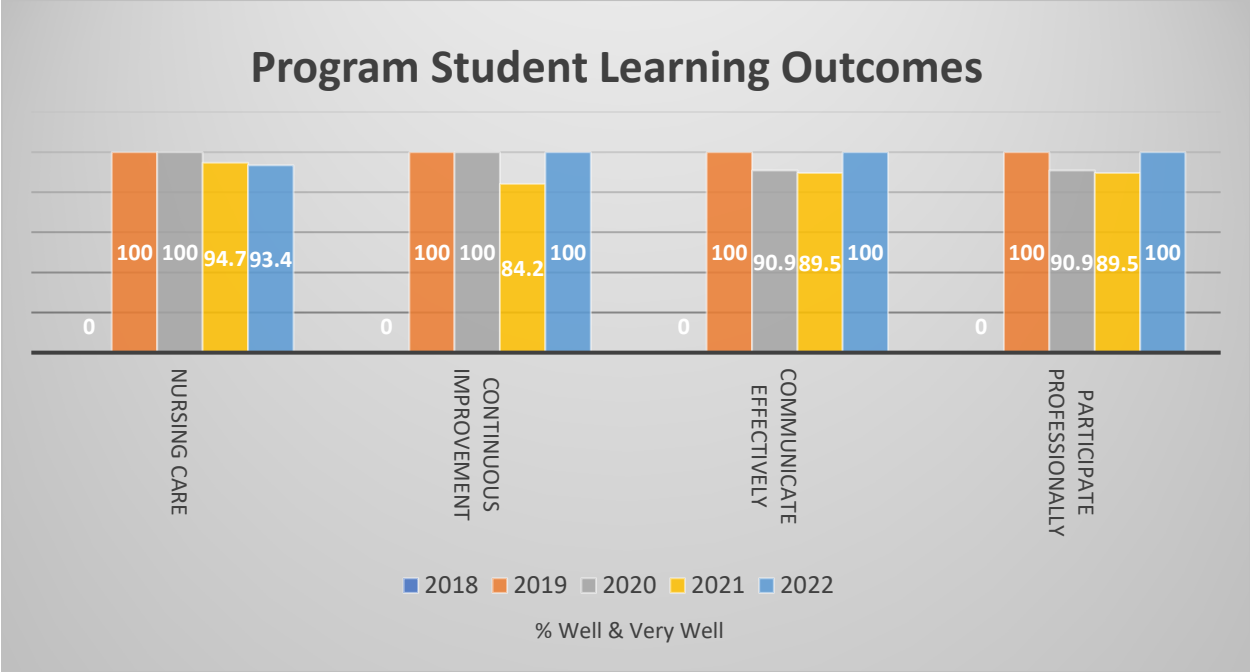
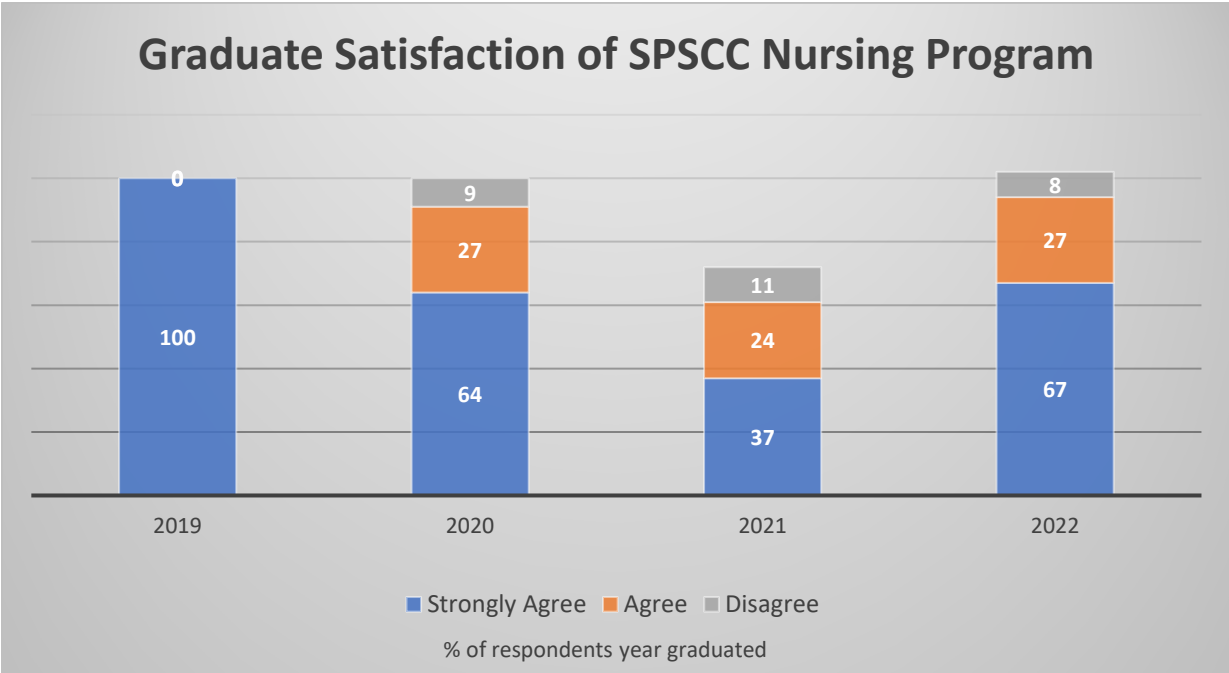

**Rates based on admission year*

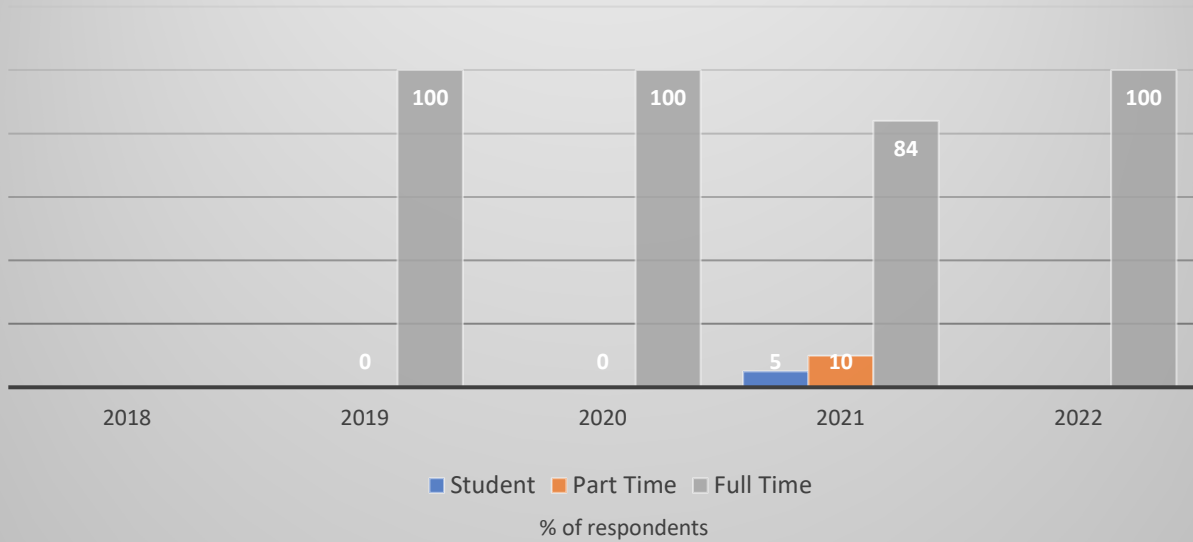
Nursing Alumni Survey Data



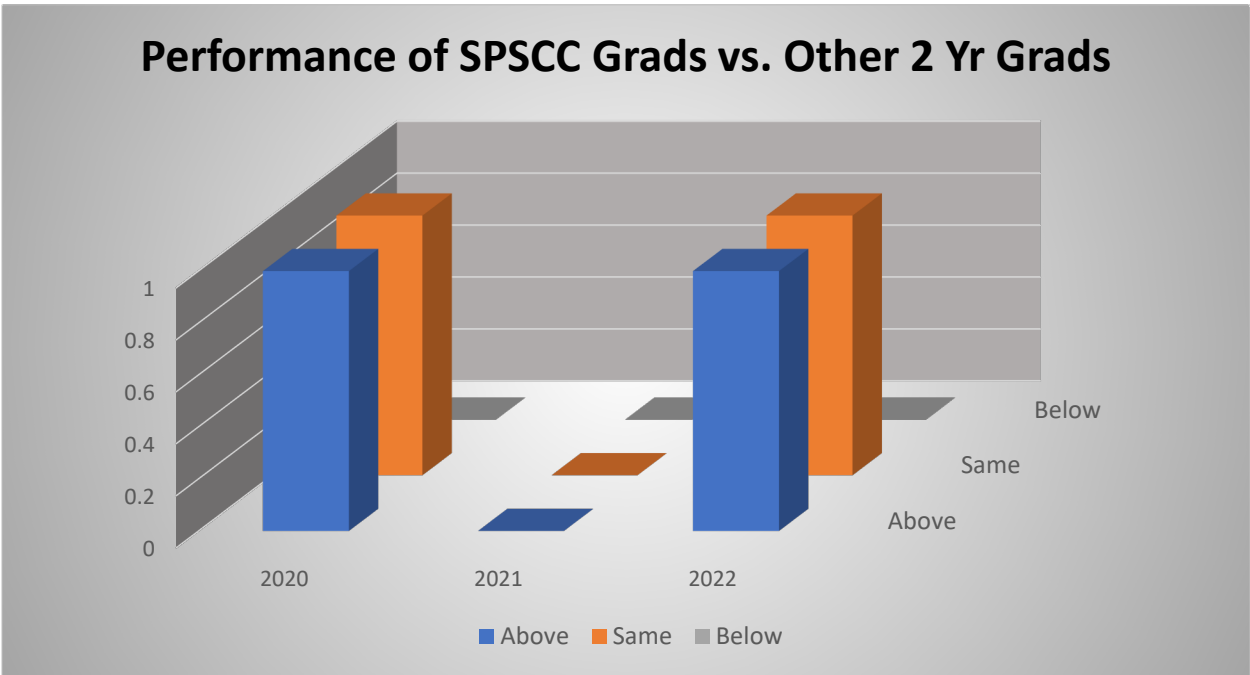

Nursing Employer Satisfaction Survey Data

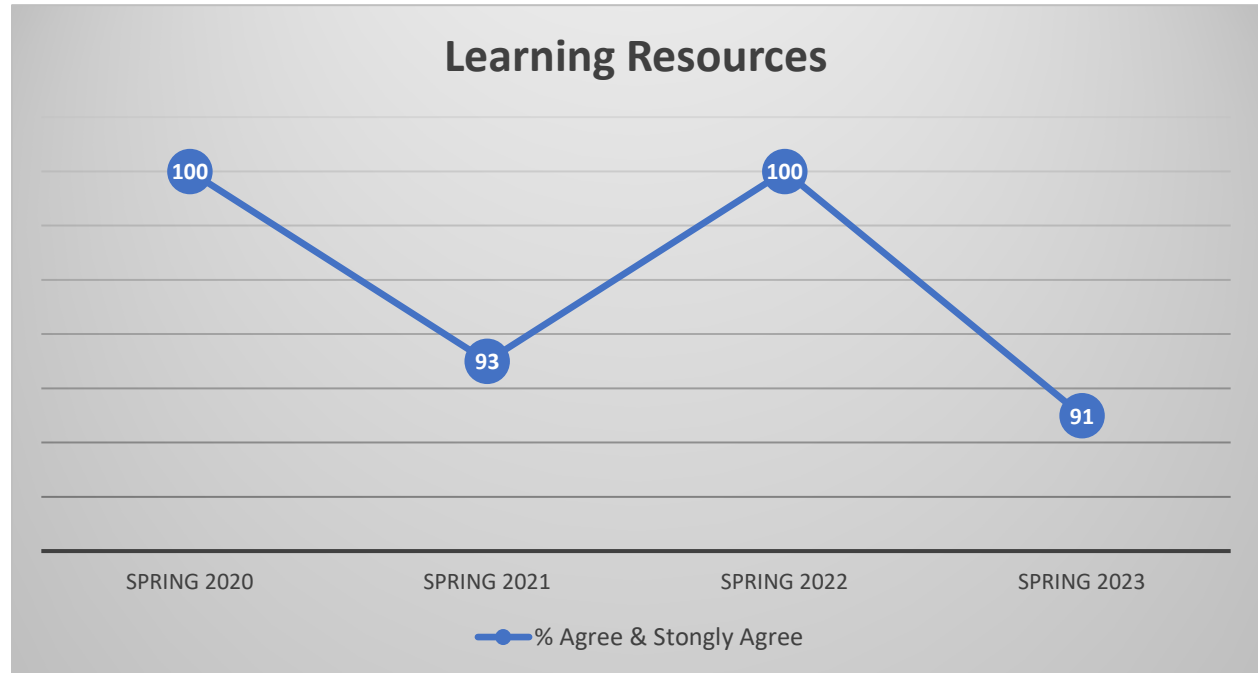

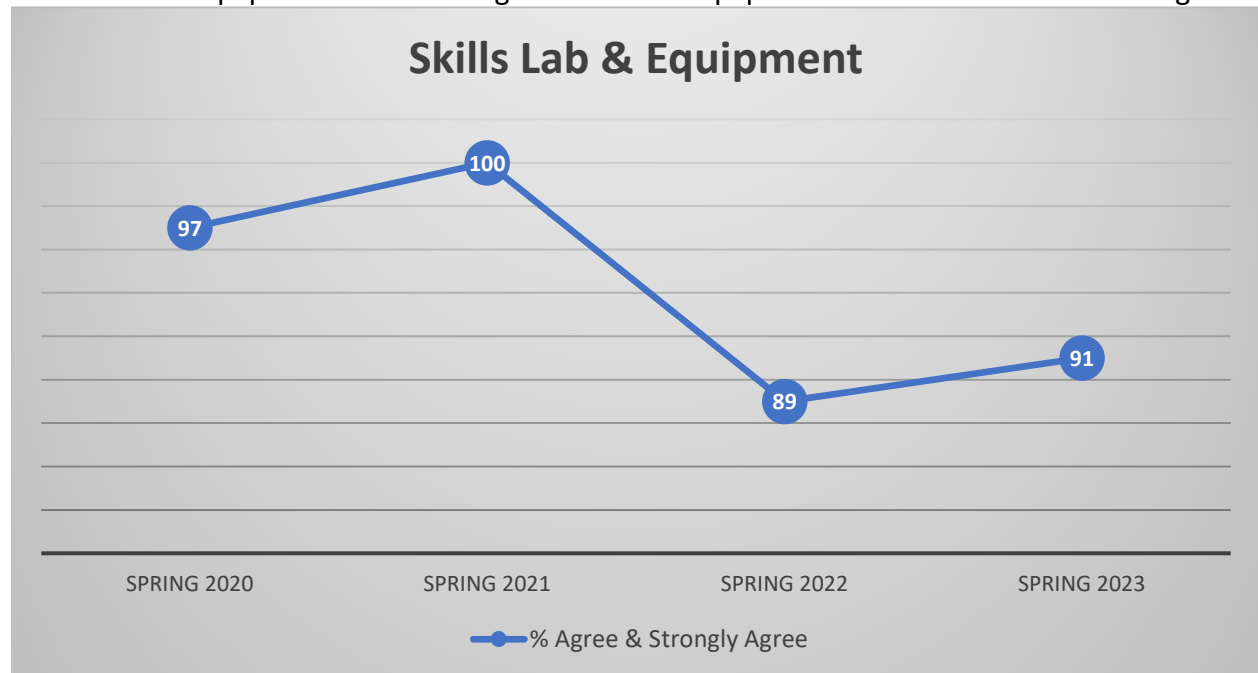

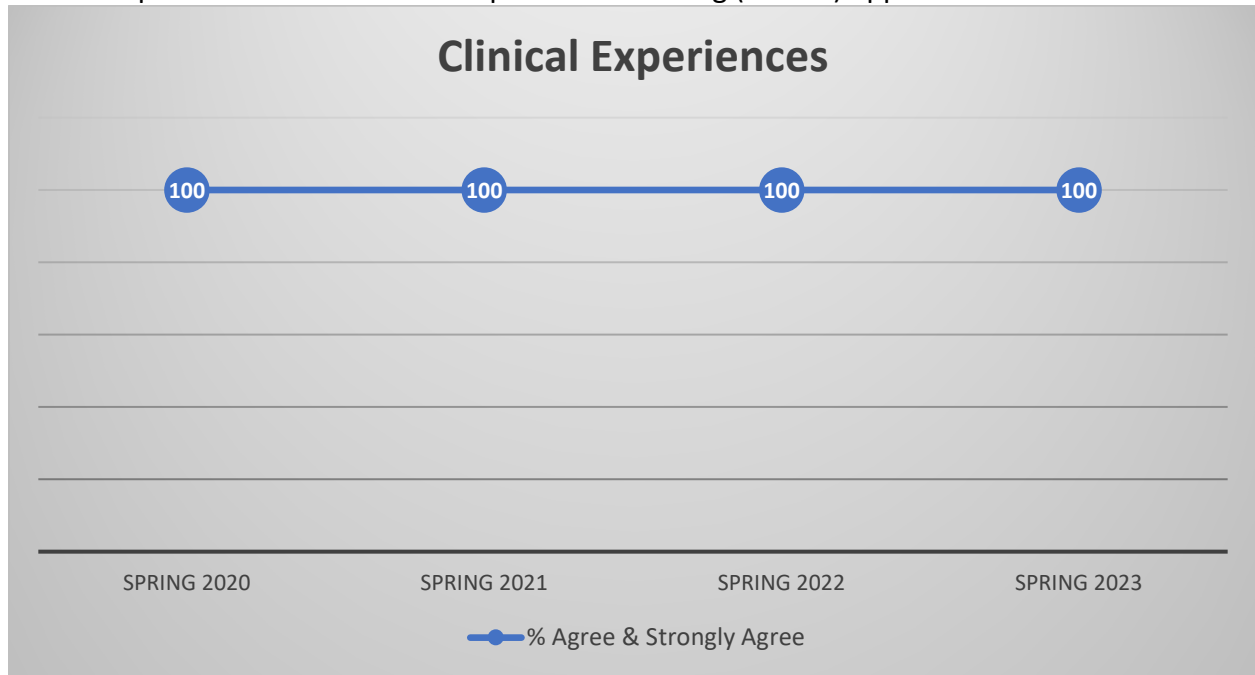
Learning Resources: The resources available to me (Canvas, open lab time, simulations, textbooks, ATI) are accessible and helpful in my learning.



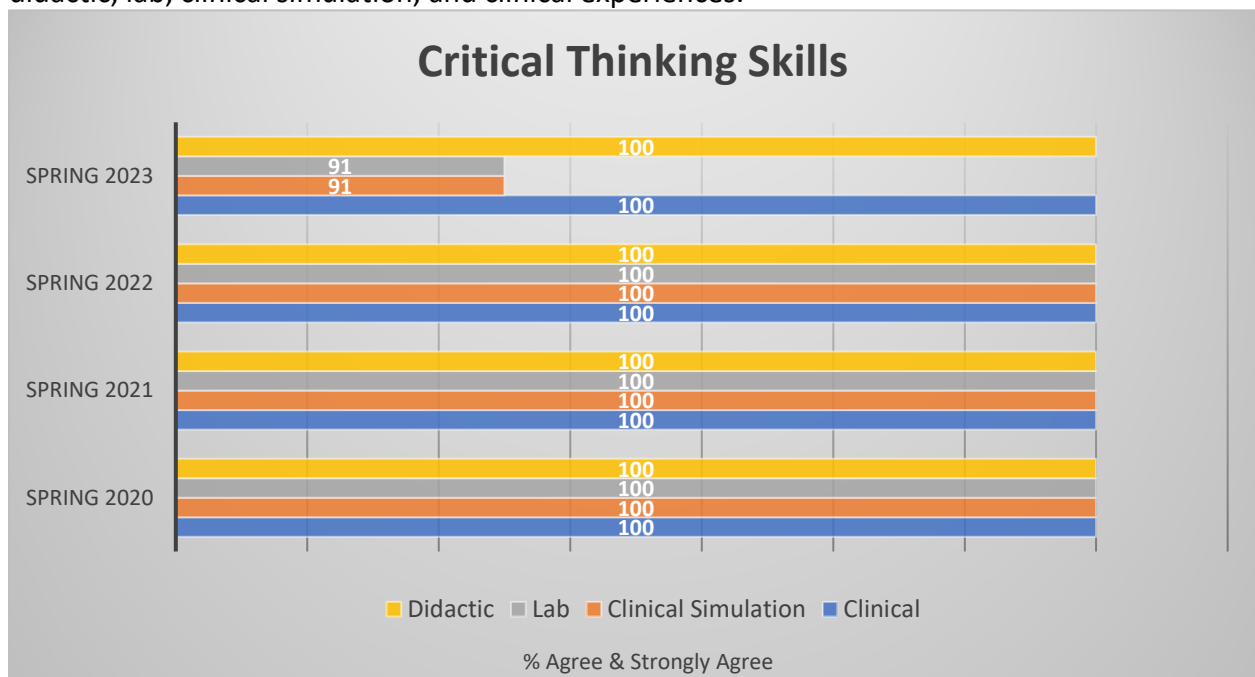
Skills Lab and Equipment: The nursing skills lab and equipment were sufficient for learning.



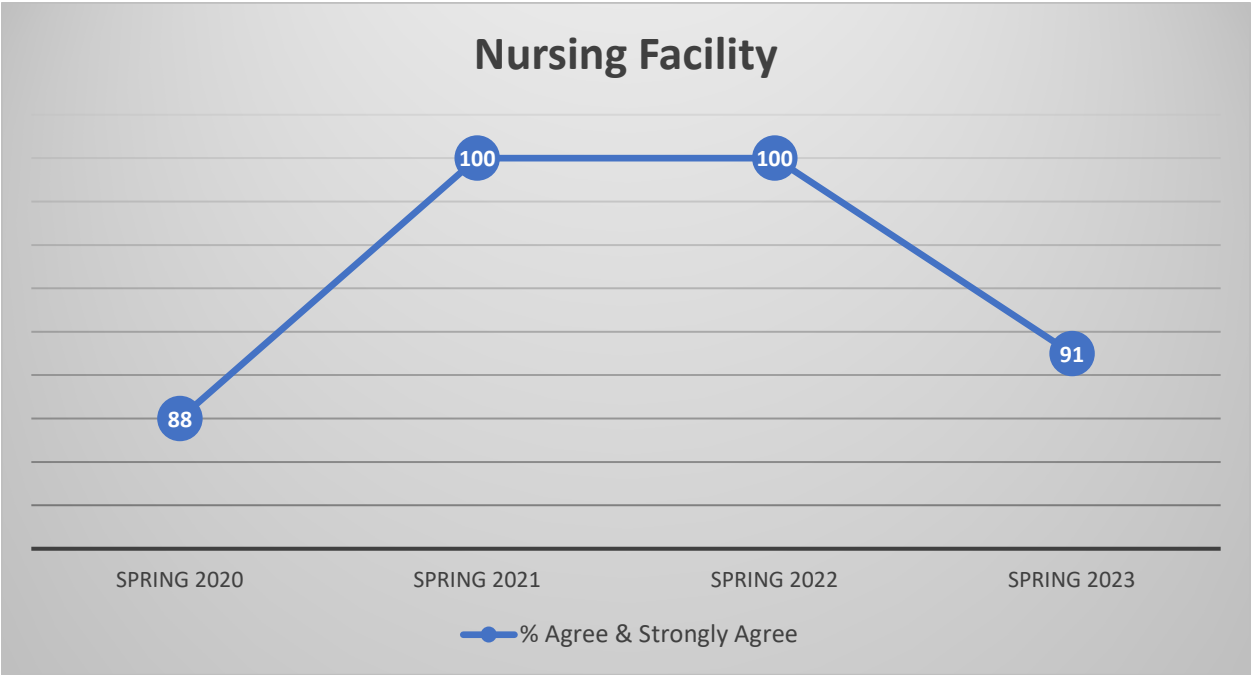
Clinical Experiences: I had diverse experiential learning (clinical) opportunities.
