80% of students responding will work in nursing (Full-time or Parttime) within 6 months of graduating




Introduction



2023-2024 Nursing Student Race and Ethnicity




















Nursing Employer Satisfaction Survey Data







Learning Resources: The resources available to me (Canvas, open lab time, simulations, textbooks, ATI) are accessible and helpful in my learning.




Skills Lab and Equipment: The nursing skills lab and equipment were sufficient for learning.






