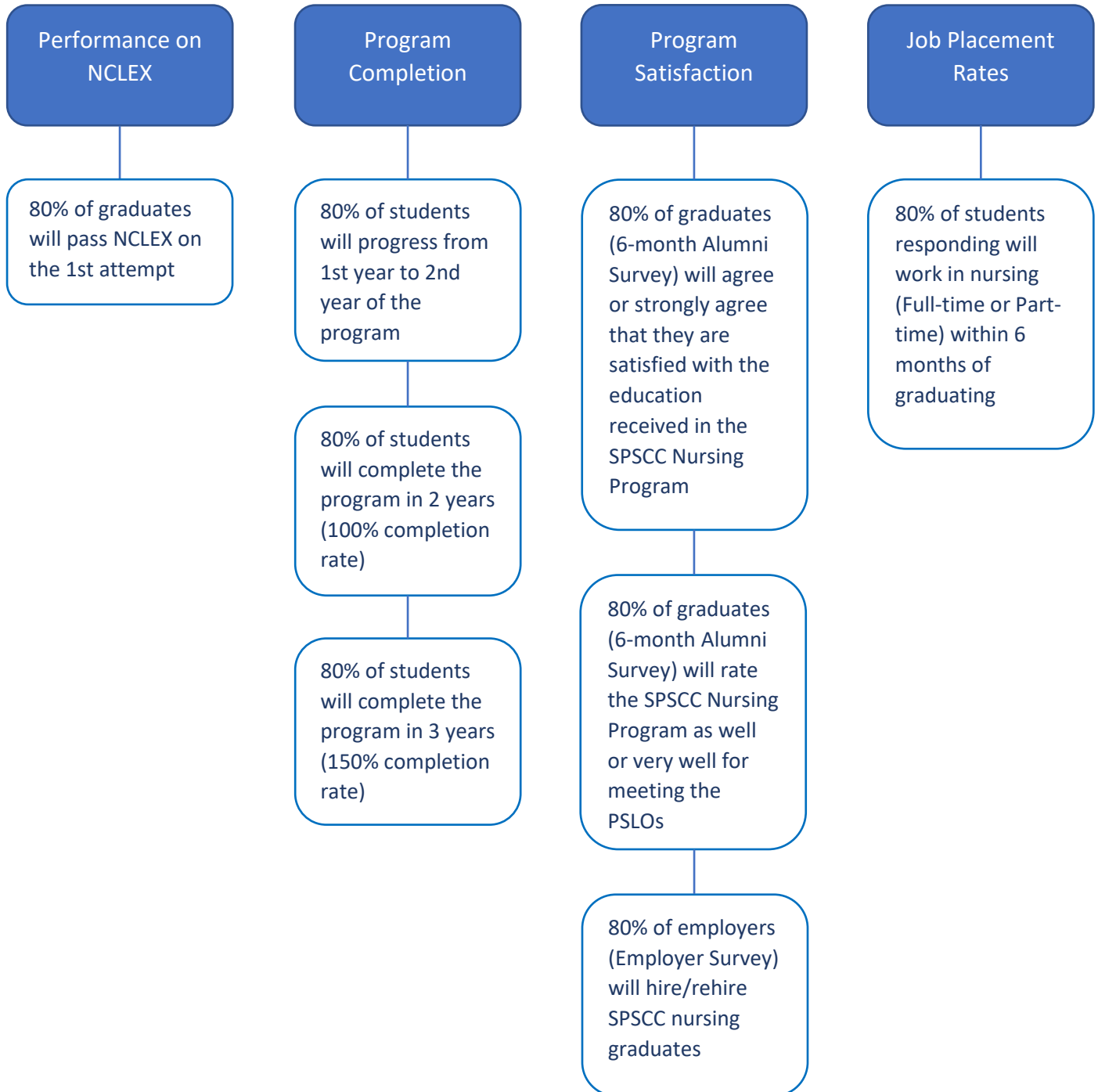

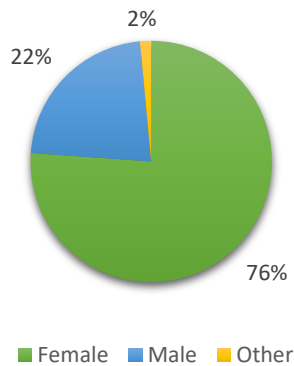
Introduction

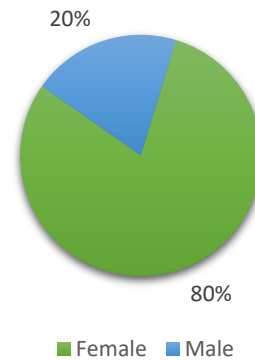

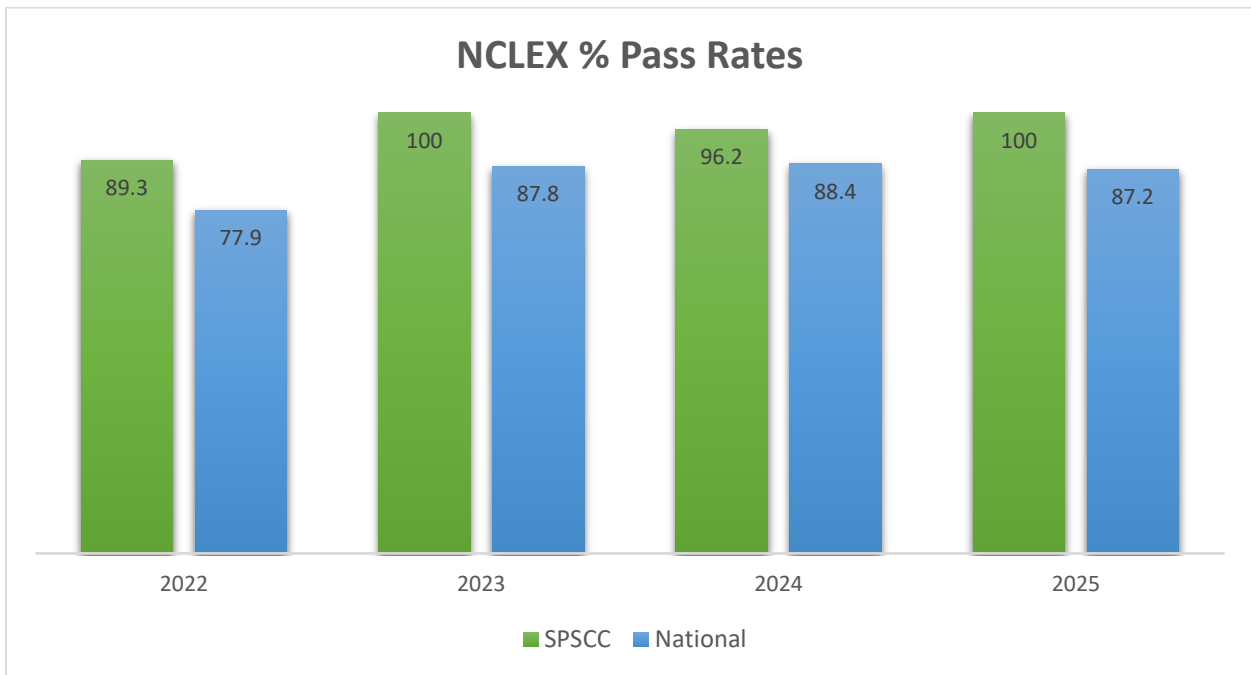

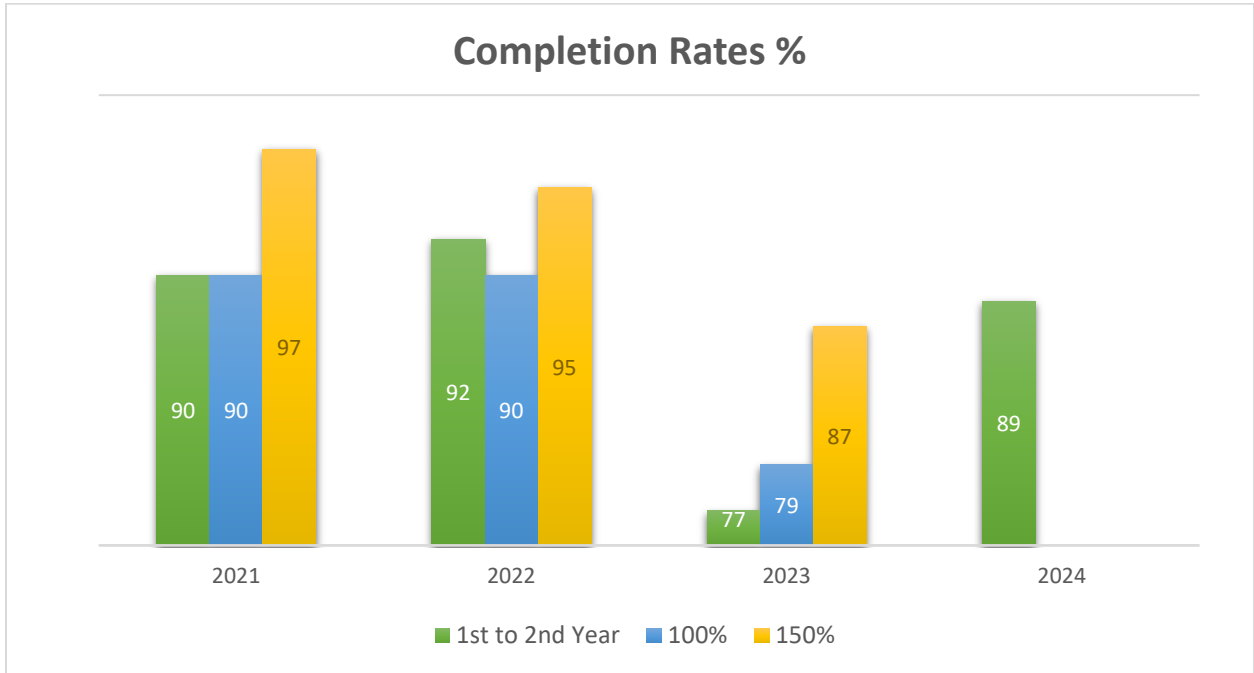

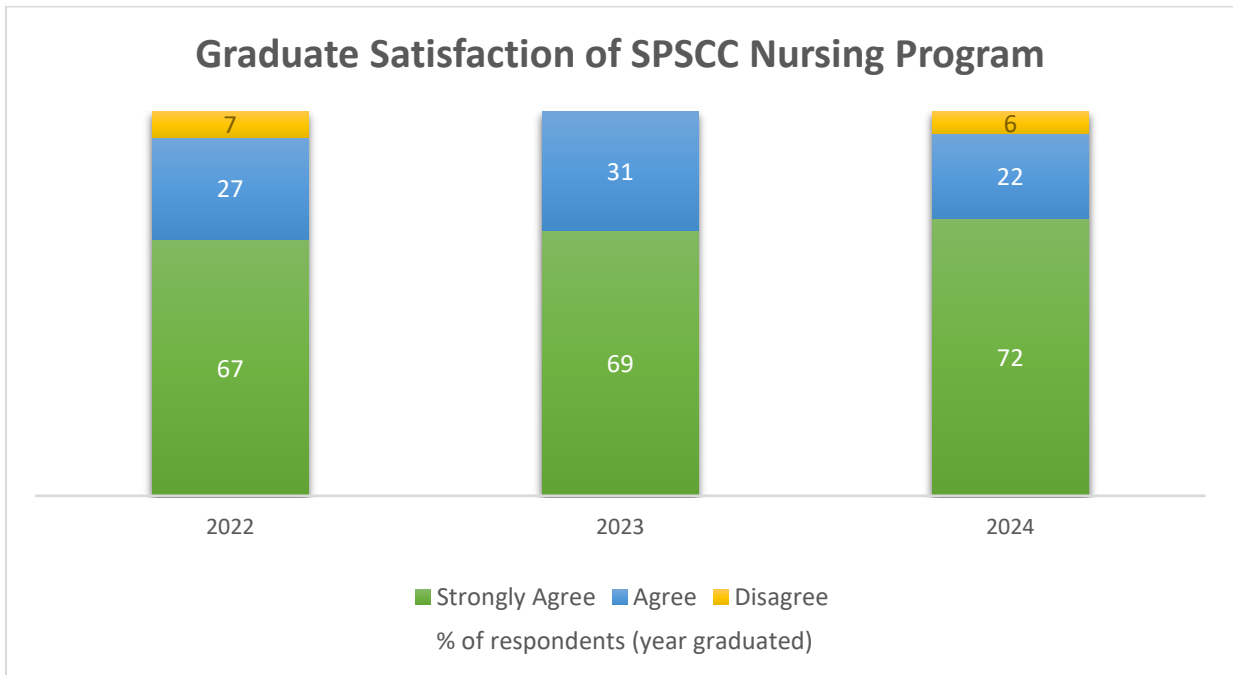

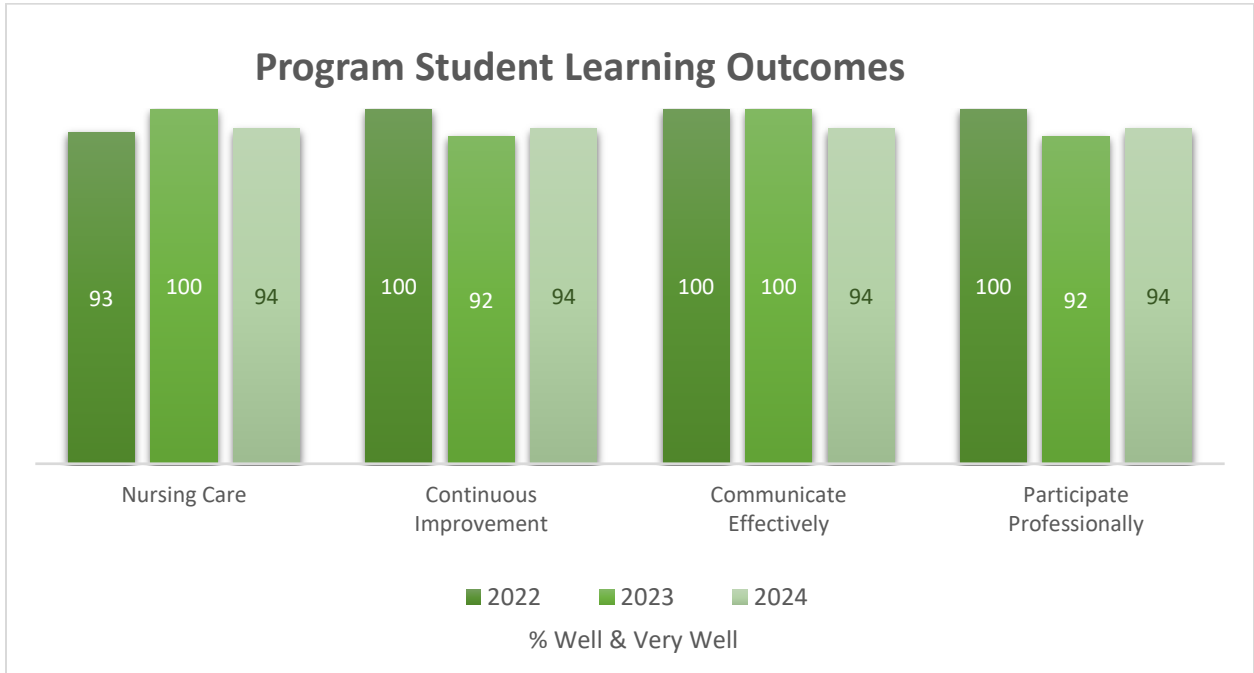
**2025 NCSBN - YTD*



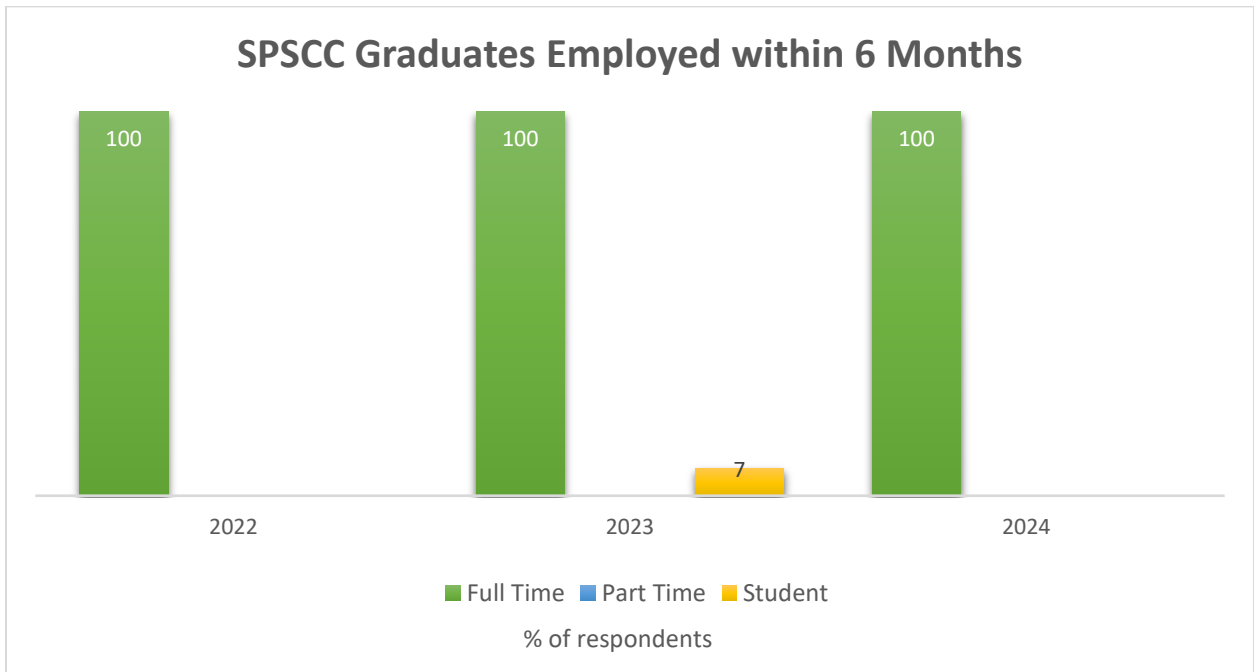
**Rates based on admission year*

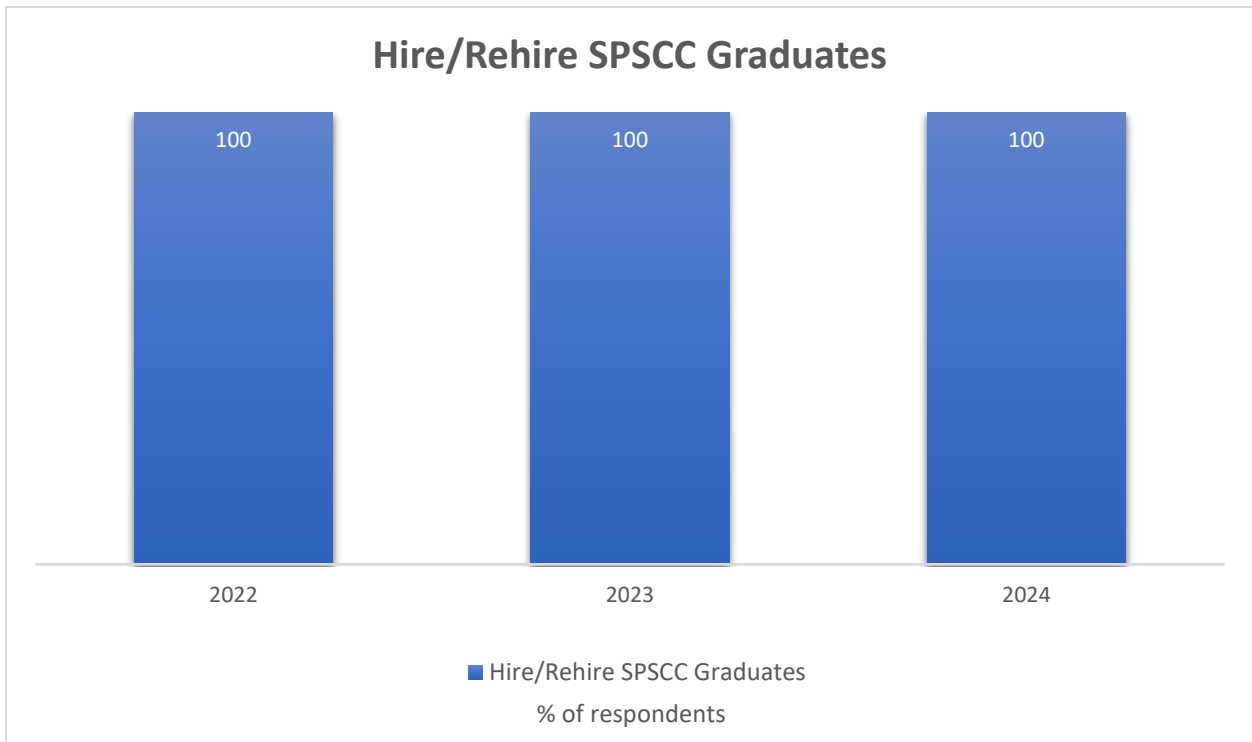
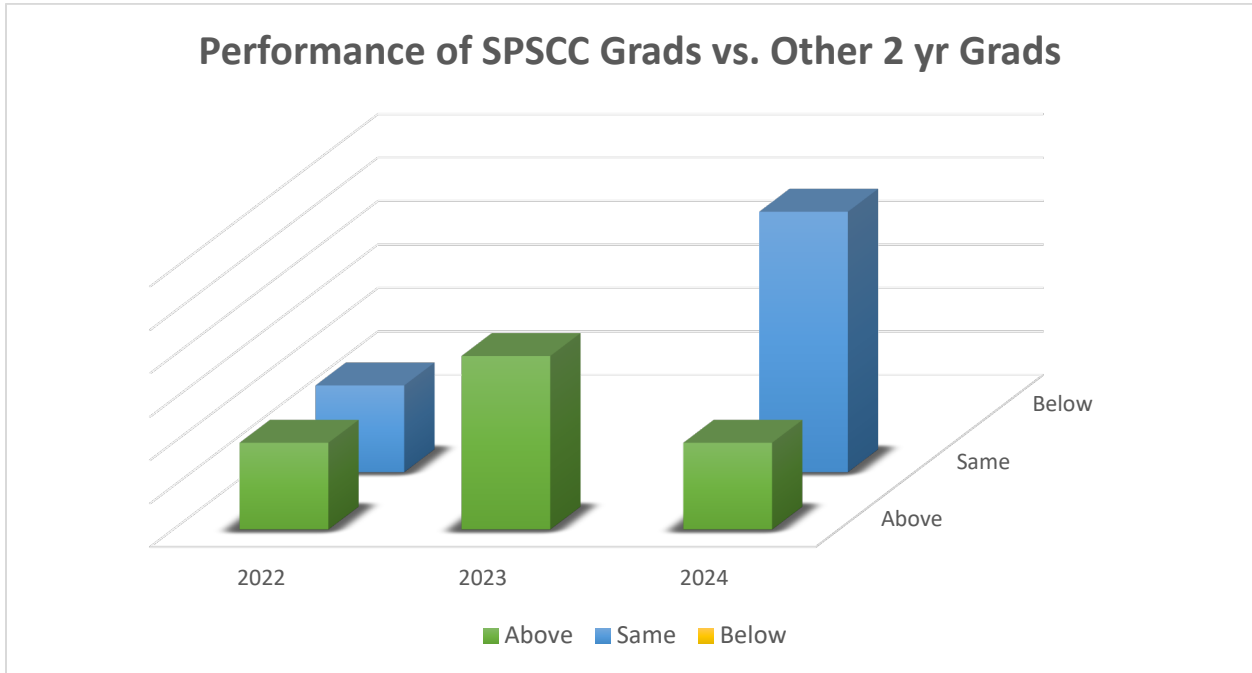




**Alumni Survey sent out 6 months after graduation*

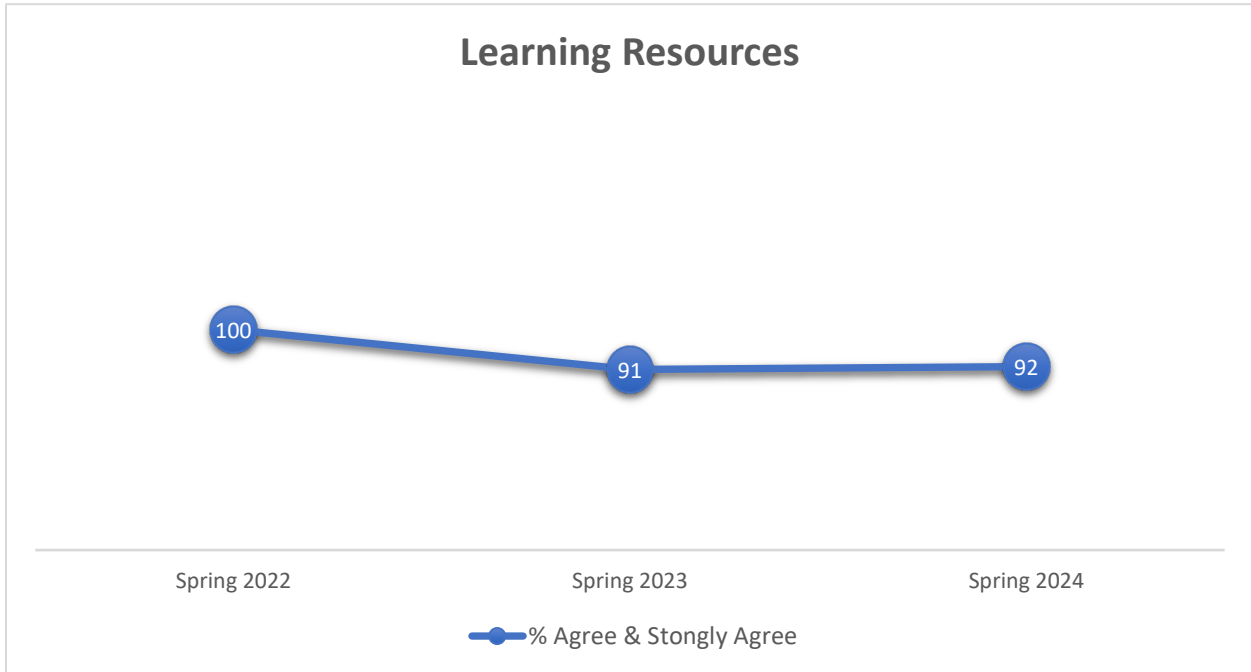


Nursing Employer Satisfaction Survey Data

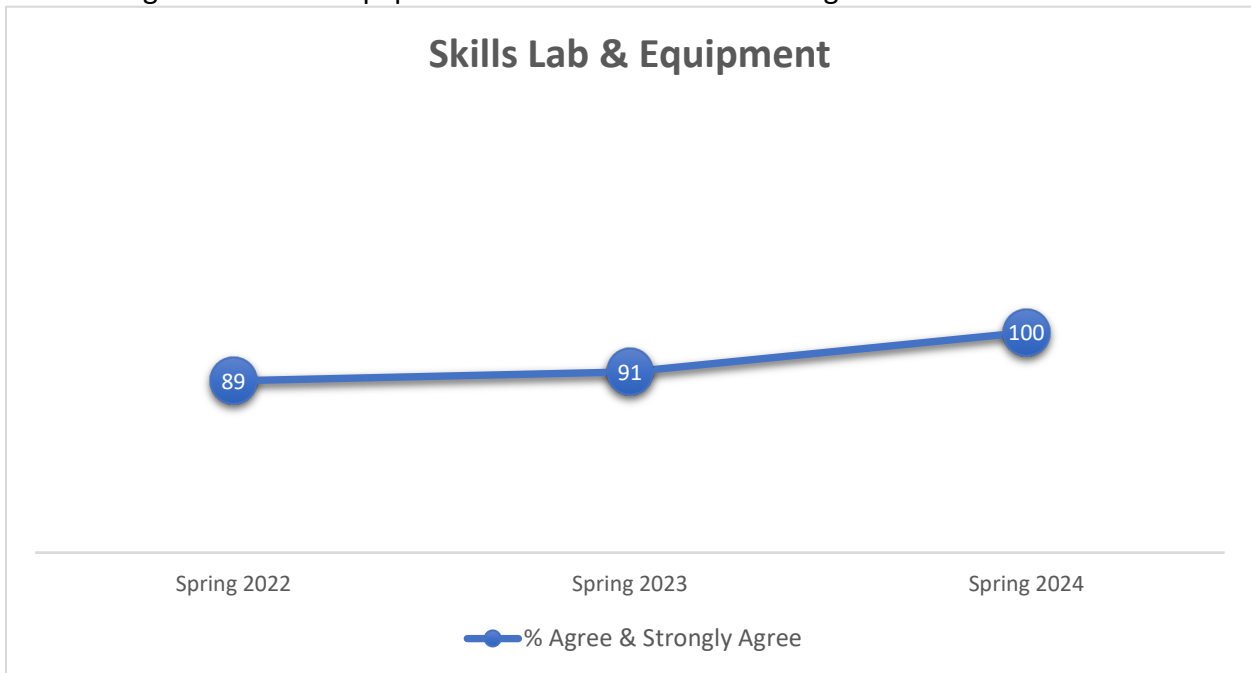

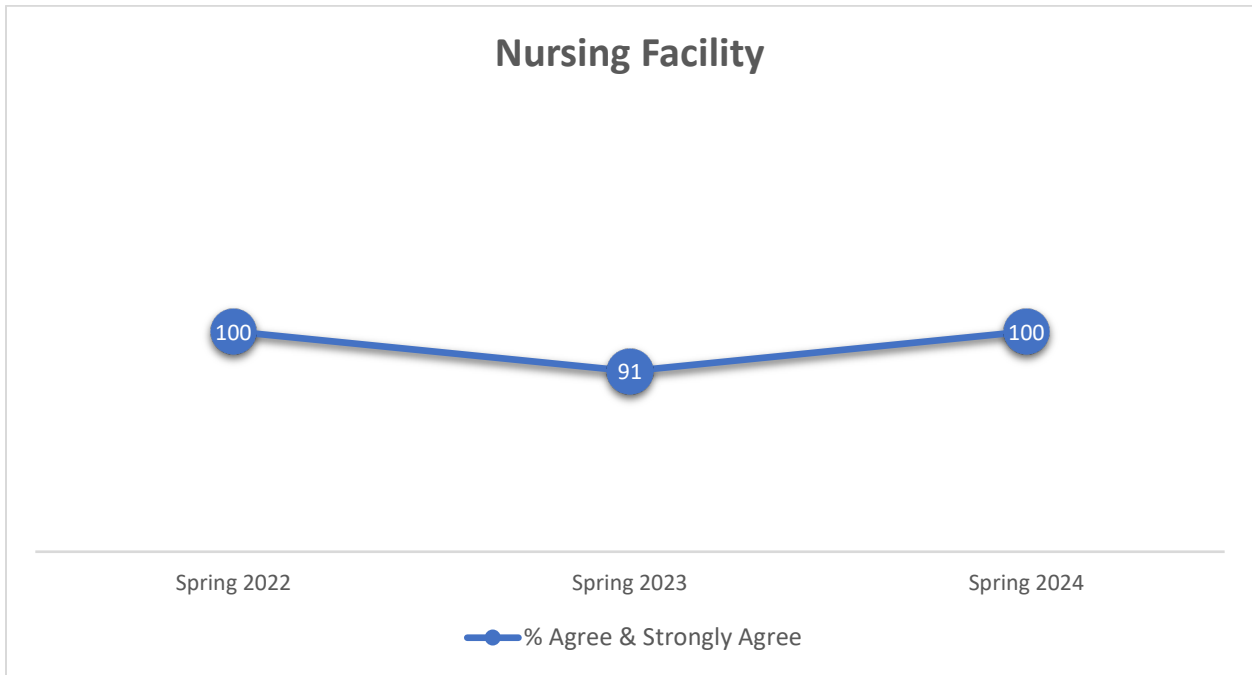
