

OLYMPIA SCHOOL DISTRICT SPSCC Course Equivalencies 2025-2026

Students should check with their high school Counselor for the specific credits they need to complete. Course equivalency is set by the high school. Failure to meet with your high school Counselor on a regular basis could result in not meeting high school graduation requirements. High school credit is granted at a rate of 5 college credits to 1 high school credit.

<i>Note: Students are encouraged to completed Algebra II before attempting to place for college math. BUS 104, BUS 240, ACCT& 201 and MATH 101 are non-transferable quantitative courses to four year schools. CMATH 107, CMATH 146 and AMATH 141 are tuition paid by the student. High school 3rd math credit is only awarded if credit earned from A/CMATH is transcribed as MATH 107, 146 or 141. Check with SPSCC for more information.</i>

3rd Science Credit	1	5	Any other course (except MATH) in the SPSCC Natural Sciences Distribution (including additional lab science courses)
Health	0.5	3	PE 180, 185, 187 or NUTR& 101 or PSYC 270
Fitness	1.5	8	PE 100+ (except: PE 185, 187)
<i>Note: PE 180 will receive .5 credit for Health or elective AND .5 credit for PE or elective; NUTR& 101 will receive .5 credit for Health AND .5 credit 3rd year science OR .5 credit elective, PSYC 270, PE 185 and PE 187 will receive .5 credit for Health AND .5 credit elective.</i>

High School & Beyond Plan			
<i>High School & Beyond Plan (HSBP) is a non-credit graduation requirement that must be completed in SchoolLinks. Running Start students who plan to earn an Associate Degree by graduation must take CCS 101 at SPSCC within the first two quarters of enrollment. CCS 102 or 103 is recommended to be taken the same quarter as CCS 101. The course content from the CCS classes supports the required tasks in SchoolLinks for the HSBP. Please see your High School Counselor for more information about HSBP requirements. Please see your Educational Planner for more information about the CCS courses. Non-degree seeking students must apply for a CCS waiver at SPSCC or they will be blocked from registration after their first two quarters.</i>
