

GETTING STARTED AT SPSCC

1. If you are not a current student at SPSCC, complete the online admissions application (separate from this program application) to get a Student ID Number.

If you attended SPSCC previously, but it has been more than two quarters since you last attended, you need to reapply for admissions to reactivate your student status.

2. Activate your SPSCC email account. Application status updates will be sent only to an SPSCC email address.
3. Obtain transcripts of prior coursework or take the placement test to demonstrate eligibility for the program (see Program Information at right).
4. Complete New Student Advising and Registration online or in person.

1. The application deadline has been extended and is open as space permits. 2. All applicants must be age 21 or over prior to January 1, 2018. 3. All applications must be accompanied by a \$25.00 non-refundable application fee. Make checks or money orders payable to SPSCC. 4. Applicants are required to demonstrate eligibility for ENGL& 101 and MATH 101 either through placement testing or through prior coursework (college transcripts, high school transcripts, Smarter Balanced test scores, or AP test scores). 5. Entry into the program will be offered to the first thirty (30) applicants who complete all admission requirements, and ranking preference will be given to those applicants who have 1) previously submitted a program inquiry/request for information, and who have 2) previously completed: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • college-level English composition • college-level math • one of the following chemistry options: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ a college-level chemistry course with a grade of C or better ○ one year of high school chemistry with a grade of C or better ○ AP chemistry with a score of 3 or better 6. Transcripts of prior coursework that was not completed at SPSCC must be included with the application. Unofficial copies of transcripts may be used with the application. Official transcripts will be required only from the finalists who are accepted into the program. 7. In the event of a tie between applications, preference will be given to the earliest date that the program application was submitted. 8. The submission of a complete application does not guarantee acceptance into the program. 9. Successful applicants will be notified of their acceptance into the program by Enrollment Services.
